Dear Friends of Senior Coastsiders,

Senior Coastsiders continues to strengthen our support of successful aging for older adults in our community. We are pleased to share with you this report that highlights our activities and accomplishments during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023.

There are two aspects of our programming that began last fiscal year, that we'd like to highlight. We've significantly ramped up the technology support we provide our seniors knowing how critical it is to everyday life. Secondly, we've expanded the services we provide to the older Chinese population.

We continue to advocate for the needs of older adults in our community and have engaged with elected leaders at the national, state, county, and city level. Given that about 28% of the Coastal population is aged 62+ years it is important to speak up for adequate policies, funding, and infrastructure to meet the needs and harness the opportunities that this increasing older adult population provides.

This year we developed a comprehensive vision statement, with an inclusive approach soliciting feedback from key informant interviews with City and County personnel, leaders of nonprofits serving older adults, and volunteers as well as conducting an organizational analysis with board members and staff. Here's where we landed:

Our vision is to support the successful aging of all seniors on the Coastside by providing a range of enriching services and support.

- As the growing population of older adults on the Coastside live longer, we aim to expand our in-person offerings and increase our online presence with virtual services. Our programming will reach seniors in communities throughout the Coastside, coordinated with intergenerational activities and support closer to homes.
- We believe that supporting older adults on the Coastside is a shared responsibility; we will work in partnership with public agencies, private organizations, donors, and volunteers to maintain a safety net of support.
- As a trusted partner known for making a difference in the lives of older adults, Senior Coastsiders will have the resources and environments necessary to provide innovative, transformational, evidence-based programs and services that empower and enrich seniors as they age no matter their circumstances or aspirations.
- We recognize that our funding model must adapt as attitudes towards aging change to ensure that ALL seniors on the Coastside have access to the resources they need to reach their full potential.

As our organization grows, so has our Board and staff. This year, we added new Board members Kerri Dorn, Bill Landry, April Campbell, Kathy Conroy, and Dennis Ferguson. Darcy Soares joined our staff as our program manager, Rose Hernandez as our activity coordinator and Nabor Huerta as our van driver.

We were saddened by the sudden death in November 2022 of Cara Schmaljohn, Senior Coastsiders' previous Executive Director. We hosted a Celebration of Life for her at the Center in January 2023 where friends, family, colleagues, and community members provided moving tributes about the tremendous impact she had in their lives and in the lives of people on the Coast. We have dedicated our new community garden at the south end of our building in her honor and invite you to come for a visit.

We are grateful to the individuals, foundations and local governments who have supported us financially. Thank you for your continued generosity – we couldn't do our work without you!





MAKING TECH ACCESSIBLE



In addition to the 1:1 tutoring we've been providing for several years, we received grant funding in 2023 that has enabled us to provide a tablet plus 6 months of internet access for 34 older adults during the time frame of this report. We've also added tech training classes and workshops on learning the basics of your Android, Windows, or iOS device.

BREAKING BARRIERS



We now offer English as a Second Language classes. Our Chinese community is benefiting from our tech support programming. This past year, our Chinese choir was part of a Chinese music event we hosted at the Center.

NOTEWORTHY OCCASIONS



We successfully hosted 1,178 registered runners and parked a LOT of cars at the 2022 Pumpkin Run! These efforts contributed to \$28,000 during the HMB Pumpkin Festival weekend to support local Coastside seniors.



We were happy to host the City of Half Moon Bay staff during lunch to learn about the City's Climate Action and Adaptation Plan - and play our new Climate Change Lotería game!



We invited the local Sheriff and Fire Department, along with over 60 guests, to celebrate Thanksgiving with a traditional homemade lunch. Festivities were brightened by a live Spanish Guitarist and raffle of the beautiful handmade floral / pumpkin centerpieces made by one of our volunteers.



We were thrilled to welcome US Representative Anna Eshoo, State Senator Josh Becker, District 3 Board of Supervisors member Ray Mueller, San Mateo County Chief Executive Officer Mike Callagy, City of Half Moon Bay Mayor Deborah Penrose and Councilmember Debbie Ruddock who joined our volunteers for lunch deliveries as part of our March for Meals campaign.



We organized a crew of volunteer carpenters, handy people, painters, gardeners, and others willing to lend a hand for our 32nd Annual Minor Home Repair Day to address the safety and accessibility needs of local Coastside seniors.



We aquired a 9-passenger van and had it equipped with a wheelchair lift to readily transport participants to and from our Center, to local grocery stores and on special trips and outings.

REMEMBERING CARA



Cara Schmaljohn was a passionate advocate for all Coastside seniors. She worked tirelessly at growing the range of programs and services offered, recruiting volunteers and was a key force behind the development of the downtown Half Moon Bay Senior Coastsiders location. Cara loved the community and the community loved her.

In honor of her passing, we have dedicated our community garden to Cara in hopes that her memory will live on through the cultivation and beauty of this flourishing space.



MEET ROBERT & GLORIA

Investing in Our Community's Future



The Coastside is a very special place for Robert and Gloria Zadek. It's where they first met over 46 years ago on Montara Beach. Robert grew up in San Mateo and Gloria in Medford, Oregon. But the unique qualities of the coast drew them to Half Moon Bay, which has been their home since the late 70's. They feel the Coastside aligns with their preferences for open space, outdoor activities, and small-town atmosphere. "The fact that the coast has not exploded like the rest of the Bay Area has allowed for it to maintain a tight knit community. We are all looking out for one another and we are proud to be a part of this community."

In addition to making annual donations and continued volunteer work, they decided to identify a percentage of their estate for Senior Coastsiders as an "investment in the community." They've both been volunteering at Senior Coastsiders for decades having what they call "senior genes"- an

innate appreciation and respect for older adults. So, when updating their trust recently they felt that including Senior Coastsiders was a natural fit. They want to make sure that the organization will be in a sound financial position to support the significantly increasing population of older adults living on the Coast.

Knowing how efficiently Senior Coastsiders is managed, the Zadek's have the utmost confidence that their eventual gift will be wisely spent. Robert was intimately involved as a board member for 13 years. "This organization grew from grassroots locals helping the most vulnerable older adults, into a world class senior community center.
